



The region's only Level I Trauma Center and Burn Center to treat both adults and children.

Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt, Middle Tennessee's only Level IV Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

Vanderbilt-Ingram Cancer Center, the only National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center in Tennessee to treat both adults and children.

## A Pioneer in Transplant Care

Vanderbilt Transplant Center, the nation's fifth largest transplant center by volume, gives hundreds of people new hope and longer life every year. Our transplant center performed 809 organ transplants in fiscal year 2024, including VUMC's first combined lung-kidney transplant and combined lung-liver transplant.



# Nationally Ranked Care and Discovery

VUMC's world-leading academic departments and centers make scientific discoveries, advance clinical care and train the next generation of health care professionals.



VUMC offers more than **100 residency and fellowship programs** and trains more than **1,200 resident physicians** every year.

Vanderbilt University School of Medicine received \$527.7 million in grant support from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in Fiscal Year 2023, and ranked 10th in the nation in total NIH grant funding.

Vanderbilt University Hospital, Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt and Vanderbilt Wilson County Hospital are recognized as among the best in the nation by the Leapfrog Group.

VUMC is the recipient of **four consecutive Magnet designations from the American Nurses Credentialing Center**, the highest honor an organization can receive for nursing care.

and cost-effective health care to the Mid-South.

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## VUMC contributes nearly \$1 billion in total community benefit and investment

Through our exceptional capabilities and caring spirit, VUMC responds to our communities' health needs. In fiscal year 2023, VUMC contributed \$952 million in community and other benefits. This support includes costs directly supporting patients through financial assistance (charity care) along with unreimbursed costs for government programs such as TennCare. Other benefits include community health improvement grants and investments in medical research and education for health professionals.

Community benefit figures above represent fiscal year 2023.

\*Medicare and Medicaid programs do not fully reimburse for the actual cost of treating their beneficiaries. Hospitals cannot turn these patients away or negotiate higher reimbursements. Government payers recognize this fact and expect hospitals to make up the difference through efficiencies and from other revenue sources. The financing of this unpaid government debt is considered a community benefit.



# As one of the largest employers in Tennessee, we are committed to building a strong workforce by providing education and training opportunities across the region.

#### **VUMC Nursing Scholars Program with Cumberland University**

A designated pathway for qualified students to become Vanderbilt Health nurses. This program provides tuition assistance and guarantees full-time employment with Vanderbilt once the student obtains a nursing license.

#### **Central Sterile Processing Technician Program and Medical Assistant Program with Nashville State Community College**

Both programs provide classroom instruction and hands-on clinical experience to train students in their pursuit of a high-demand health career at Vanderbilt Health. As an incentive, Vanderbilt covers the tuition, fees and salary for trainees enrolled in these programs.

#### **Vanderbilt Care Partner Academy**

A tuition-free program that provides paid training for individuals without previous health care experience to become a Care Partner and gain employment at Vanderbilt Health.

## Camp Hope Helps **Pediatric Burn Survivors**

VUMC sponsors a week-long summer camp for pediatric burn survivors ages 6-16. Camp Hope includes activities like swimming, crafts and nature hikes, along with exercises to promote physical and emotional healing for survivors of burn injuries. Campers gain new confidence and lifelong friendships at Camp Hope. VUMC covers all costs for eligible youth.



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#### Shade Tree Clinic Expands Services, Adds a Pediatric Clinic

Shade Tree Clinic, which is run by medical and nursing students and faculty mentors, has provided free primary care to underserved and uninsured adults in Nashville for nearly two decades. Recently, Shade Tree Clinic opened a pediatric clinic to better serve adolescents ages 13-17.

## **Project PAVE**Supports Students with Low Vision

Providing Access to the Visual Environment (Project PAVE) is a state-wide initiative helping Tennessee students obtain the devices and services they need to succeed. In partnership with the Tennessee Department of Education and the Tennessee Department of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, VUMC provides vision evaluations, low vision devices and special instruction and support for children in need. These services and devices are provided at no cost for eligible families.



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# Vanderbilt Orthopaedics Provides Free Surgical Treatment to the Uninsured

Vanderbilt Orthopaedics Outreach Day helped 90 uninsured or underinsured Tennesseans receive hand or sports surgeries they wouldn't otherwise be able to afford. Dozens of VUMC volunteers provided treatment for patients with painful hand conditions like carpal tunnel syndrome and ganglion cysts or who needed sports surgeries like shoulder and knee arthroscopies.



As a nonprofit, we rely on the generosity of donors to provide world-class care, advance research and train future health care heroes.

- Provides training and immersive experiences for the next generation of health care professionals








## Caring for children and families doesn't end after a hospital stay

### Taking Action Toward a Healthier Future

At VUMC, we recognize that working to improve the health of our environment will also improve the health of our patients. Across all our hospitals and clinics, we are taking steps to be good stewards of our resources and work more sustainably.





#### **By the Numbers**

Our recycling initiatives span all seven of our hospital campuses and our network of clinics, laboratories and academic spaces.

Last year, VUMC recycled:



766 tons of cardboard.

5.2 million pounds of paper through Shred-it, saving 44,435 trees and 7,800 cubic yards of landfill space.

30,546 single-use medical devices through Medline ReNewal, diverting more than 2,200 pounds of waste and avoiding 42.38 metric tons of carbon emissions.

Nearly 80 tons of mixed plastic and aluminum.





### Creating a sustainable supply chain

Vanderbilt Health is a proud member of the Healthcare Industry Resilience Collaborative, a nonprofit association focused on building a more transparent and resilient supply chain for the benefit of all.

Vanderbilt sources medical supplies through environmentally preferred contracts when possible, and prioritizes products that are multi-use, contain recycled packaging and are free of potentially harmful chemicals.

### **Building safe and healthy environments**

Vanderbilt Health has been awarded 17 LEED Gold or Silver Certifications for construction or renovations that meet internationally recognized standards for healthy, efficient and cost-saving buildings.

#### Vanderbilt Health's green building achievements:

- Decreasing indoor water use
- Lowering power usage for interior lighting
- Increasing use of low-emitting and recycled materials
- Reducing construction waste
- Prioritizing regional materials







## VUMC Teams with Royal Philips to Reduce Radiology Emissions


VUMC and Royal Philips have launched a collaborative research project that aims to decarbonize the health system's radiology department. The effort is measuring and addressing energy consumption of diagnostic imaging devices including MR, CT, ultrasound and X-ray. Initial results show that sustainable initiatives can be both environmentally friendly and cost-effective.



### Going the extra mile to reduce traffic emissions

Vanderbilt Health partners with WeGo Public Transit to provide free bus fare for all Davidson County employees for rides to and from work. We also offer reduced bus and commuter train fares for employees who reside outside of Davidson County.

Vanderbilt Health employees can receive discounted parking rates for forming carpools. To encourage environmentally friendly modes of transportation, Vanderbilt Health has increased the number of electric vehicle charging stations, motorcycle and scooter parking spots, bicycle racks and shower facilities.







## Lowering energy consumption and increasing savings

In the past five years, Vanderbilt has installed energy-efficient air and heating units and automated light controls to reduce energy consumption.

The result? A 10% decrease in kilowatt usage and \$2 million in electrical savings. The environmental impact is equivalent to reducing carbon emissions by 17 tons.
