Central Sterile Processing Technician (CSPT)

· Program Length: 10-weeks

 $\cdot\,10$ -rainees per class, 2-classes a year

The Central Sterile Processing Technician program is a partnership between Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC), Center for Programs in Allied Health (CPiAH) and Nashville State Community College (NSCC). This program provides a unique opportunity for students to pursue a health career that is in high demand and gain employment as a Central Sterile Processing Technician at Vanderbilt University Medical Center.

Clinical Lab Assistant/Phlebotomy (CLA)

· Program Length: 12-weeks

 \cdot 10-trainees per class, 2-classes a year

Working as a clinical laboratory assistant, you'll be responsible for preparing biological specimens, such as blood and tissues, for medical examinations.

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)

Program Length: 12-Weeks

 \cdot 10-trainees per class, 3-classes a year

Primary focus of the Emergency Medical Technician is to provide basic and limited emergency medical care and transportation for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system.

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Medical Assistant (MA)

· Program Length: 12-weeks

· 15-20-trainees per class, 4-classes a year

The Medical Assistant program is a partnership between Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC), Center for Programs in Allied Health (CPiAH) and Nashville State Community College (NSCC). This program provides a unique opportunity for students to pursue a health career that is in high demand and provides the opportunity to work as a Medical Assistant at Vanderbilt University Medical Center.

Neurodiagnostic Technology (NDT)

Program Length: 12-months

· Four trainees per class, one class per year

Neurodiagnostic technology, provide technical support to neurologists by monitoring and testing various functions of the human brain and nervous system.

Ophthalmic Assistant (OPA)

Program Length: 9-months

· 4-trainees per class, 1-class a year

Ophthalmic medical assistant work with an ophthalmologist (eye doctor) to provide patient care by performing eye-related clinical tasks. This career is a good fit for those with an interest in science and math, a commitment to helping people and good problemsolving skills.

Pharmacy Technician (PT)

· Program Length: 12-weeks

· 10-rainees per class, 2-classes a year

Pharmacy Technician Trainees provide assistance to pharmacists with administrative tasks and learn how to fill prescriptions, respond to customer inquiries, update records, and other tasks as assigned.
