Vanderbilt's first Magnet designation was received in November 2006, becoming the first medical center in Middle Tennessee to achieve this status. In April 2012, Vanderbilt received its second designation. We have applied and are journeying toward our third, which could be awarded late this year.

Sabrina Downs, MSN, MBA, RN, NE-BC, Vanderbilt's Director of Professional Practice and Magnet, upon submitting this year's document said, "It is an honor to coordinate the representation of our great organization for recognition within our Magnet document. I believe the Magnet recognition is the gold standard of nursing care, professionalism, and outcomes within our organization, the community, and the global

health care field. Magnet organizations are also recognized by heath care accrediting

organizations for their impact on patient safety and quality care."


Keep it comin'. I'm on board.

This year's web-based submitted document is comprised of answers and specific examples in response to 72 questions and requests for information—primarily in the form of data. This year's document differs from our first two designations' documents in that this time we were required to provide evidence to prove our statistics from the first two designations have significantly improved. Examples submitted came from all entities across Vanderbilt, and each showcases Vanderbilt's status as a cutting-edge institution paving the path for innovation, research, commitment to quality patient care, and staff satisfaction, recognition, and advancement. Take a look at a side-by-side comparison of this year's document and our second designation's document:
