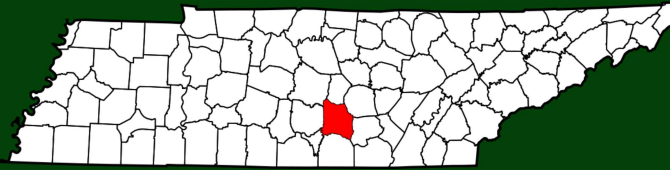

29,683 Discharges (inpatient + outpatient)

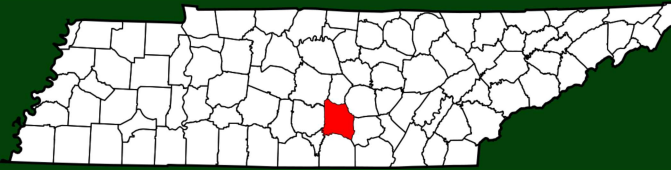

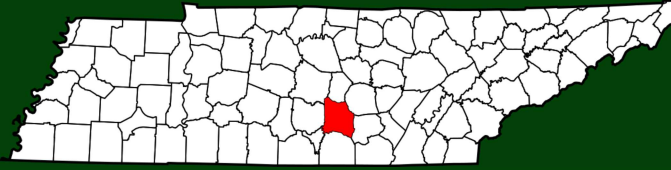
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County Facts

- 150 Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) assessments reviewed, approved, and consulted by the VCOE for DCS
- 1,338 technical assists to DCS provided by VCOE on the Family Advocacy Support Tool (FAST) to create non-custodial plans
- 9 third party reviews/consults to DCS in support of the Toddler & Infant Need and Strengths (TINS) tool to create a family centered plan for the Safe Baby Court Team to implement
- 115 assessments completed by Juvenile Courts using the Juvenile Justice Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (JJ-CANS) tool with the support of VCOE to assist in identifying community resources and family centered planning
- ≤5 training/certifications provided by VCOE to Juvenile Court Staff for the JJ-CANS tool to assist in the creation of a probation plan
- 6 at-risk youth and families who received specialized, multi-disciplinary case reviews by VCOE
- ≤5 psychiatric medication consultations provided by VCOE to DCS regional nurses
- 360 visits to VUMC Retail Clinics
