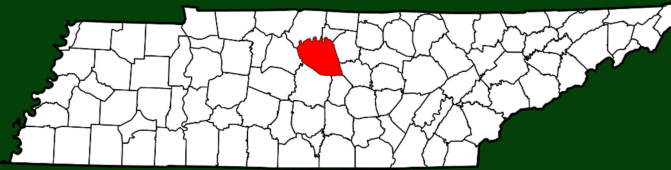

71,615 Discharges (inpatient + outpatient)

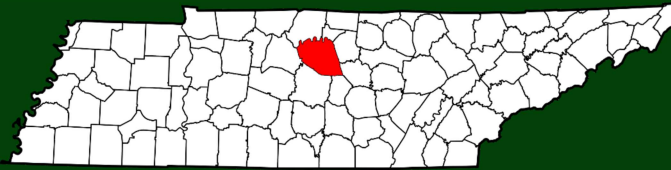

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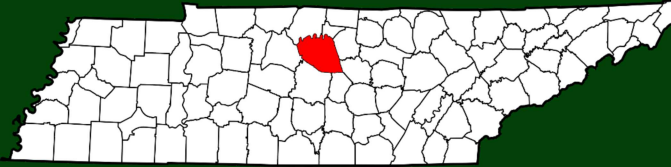
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County Facts

- 33 Department of Children Services (DCS) staff trained and certified by the Vanderbilt Center of Excellence (VCOE) to use standardized assessments to assist in services planning for children in state custody and their families
- 147 Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) assessments reviewed, approved, and consulted by the VCOE for DCS
- 1,909 technical assists to DCS provided by VCOE on the Family Advocacy Support Tool (FAST) to create non-custodial plans
- 12 assessments completed by Juvenile Courts using the Juvenile Justice Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (JJ-CANS) tool with the support of VCOE to assist in identifying community resources and family centered planning
- ≤5 training/certifications provided by VCOE to Juvenile Court Staff for the JJ-CANS tool to assist in the creation of a probation plan
- 6 at-risk youth and families who received specialized, multi-disciplinary case reviews by VCOE
- ≤5 psychiatric medication consultations provided by VCOE to DCS regional nurses
- 6 schools provided Sports Medicine Services
- 3,625 students served by Sports Medicine
- ≤5 Sports Medicine presentations to coaches/parents
- 267 Home Health Visits
- 11,993 visits to VUMC Retail Clinic
- ≤5 visits to Radiation Oncology Centers - managed by Vanderbilt Health Service (VHS)

- 416 Psychiatric Hospital inpatient discharges (adults + peds)

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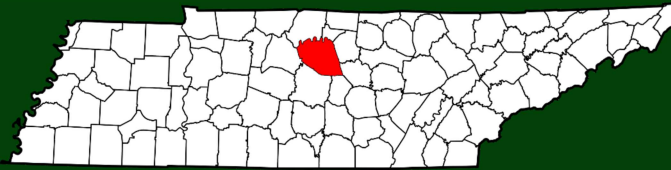
