WE SAVE LIVES.

- The Tennessee Poison Center is the only poison control center in the state of Tennessee.
- Prescription drug overdose is **the number one cause of injury death** in Tennessee, from the latest data available.
- The Poison Help hotline is not just for children, poisoning can happen to anyone at any age. **Anything is poisonous** if consumed in the wrong way, by the wrong person, in the wrong amount, or through an envenomation (bite or sting) exposure.
- More than 61% of human exposure calls in 2023 involved pharmaceuticals.

WE ARE DEDICATED TO PREVENTING PEDIATRIC POISONINGS.

- In 2023, 47% of poisonings reported to the TPC involved children ages 5 years and younger.
- Unintentional medication exposures remain a serious threat to young children.
- Safe storage of potentially toxic items and teaching children to "Ask First" will prevent a poison emergency.

WE ARE ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT RAPID RESPONSE TEAMS IN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE.

- The TN Poison Center partners with the Tennessee Department of Health and County Health Departments to monitor public health events and possible viral, chemical, and biological threats.
- In the event of a national or public health emergency, the TN Poison Center maintains the surge capacity to handle large call volumes.

WE PREVENT UNNECESSARY USE OF EMERGENCY RESOURCES AND SAVE TAX DOLLARS.


- In 2023, we found in our annual call survey that an estimated **83% of people would have gone to the hospital or called 911** if the TN Poison Center had not existed.
- We also found that an estimated 27% of patients who called the hotline were underinsured or had no insurance.
- In 2023, the Tennessee Poison Center **saved an estimated \$21.4 million in taxpayer dollars**. Tennesseans can now use those essential dollars saved for food, shelter, transportation, clothing, education, and other necessities for their families and communities.











POISON EXPOSURE BY MANAGEMENT SITE



REASON FOR EXPOSURE




