Featured Member: Andrew Smith, MD, MSCI, MMHC



Andrew Smith, MD, MSCI, MMHC is an Associate Professor of Pediatrics and a staff cardiac intensivist in the pediatric cardiac intensive care unit at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt. He completed fellowships in Pediatric Cardiology and Pediatric Critical Care Medicine at Vanderbilt, as well as a Senior Clinical Fellowship in Cardiac Intensive Care at Boston Children's Hospital. He earned a Masters of Science in Clinical Investigation and a Masters of Management in Health Care at Vanderbilt, and is in the process of completing a Masters of Health and Clinical Informatics at Oregon Health Sciences University. He is an Epic physician builder and a member of VCLIC, VDAWGS, and the Epic Pediatric Cardiology steering board.

His research interests include leveraging multicenter administrative, clinical, and physiologic datasets to inform and improve complex decision-making in the care of children with heart disease, as well as more recently better understanding electronic communication behaviors between healthcare team members caring for children at risk for acute clinical deterioration. He's looking forward to having the opportunity to collaborate with fellow VCLIC members on anything and everything at the intersection of clinical informatics and the care of critically ill children with heart disease.
